Thank you for your requests for access to documents, which the EEAS has examined in the framework of Regulation (EC) No $1049/2001^{1}$.

Following your request, we have made a search in the EEAS filing systems, the document management databases and archives, but were unable to identify any document matching your request.

Please note that the EEAS as a body of the European Union which supports the High Representative does not have any operational role with regard to:

- 1. Transfer of personal data that would be processed in the context of surveillance, police, migration, biometric databases mentioned in the point 1 of your request.
